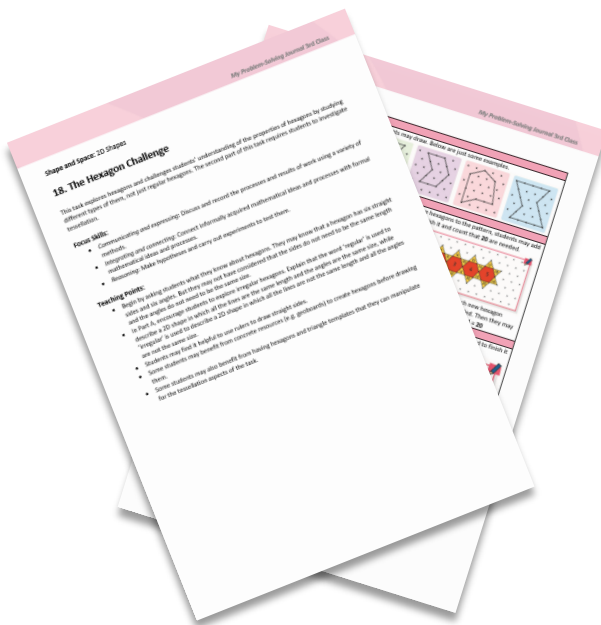
in Three Simple Steps

1. Select a Problem

Use the contents page to find a problem that matches the topic you are working on with your class.

If you are using *Planet Maths* or *Busy at Maths*, there are handy guides online to help you find problems to match the chapters in your book.

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2. Find the Teaching Notes

Locate the Teaching Notes to match the problem. They include a concise explanation of the problem, prompts to support children, and solutions.

3. Work on the Problem

Have your students work on the problem in mixed-ability pairs or groups. Use the Teaching Notes to guide discussion and scaffold children as they work.
